Chief Justice Cantil-Sakauye was born in Sacramento and attended C. K. McClatchy High School, Sacramento City College, and University of California, Davis, for her Bachelor's and law degrees.

The chief justice is a role model for today's youth and tomorrow's leaders. You will not want to miss this intelligent, passionate, and eloquent judicial leader.
